

Every Student, Every Day

The LCAP process encourages data-informed decision-making to ensure that LBUSD is focused on meeting the needs of every student, every day.

Throughout the year, the district utilizes multiple measures to collect data to determine areas of strength and need, including:

- **Achievement Data - CAASPP, ELPAC, interim assessments, benchmarks, ACT, AP, SAT, college and career readiness**
- **Engagement Data - attendance, suspension, expulsion**
- **Social and Emotional - CA Healthy Kids Survey, School Climate Survey, Social/Emotional Universal Screeners**
- **Facilities/Resources - BrightBytes, FIT, technology inventory**
- **Stakeholder Feedback - LCAP Survey, California Parent Survey, CA Healthy Kids Survey**

Purpose of the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)

Why do schools need to create a Single Plan for Student Achievement?

- Plan to improve the academic performance of all students.
- Meet the planning requirements of state and federal categorical programs.

School Site Council (SSC)

The School Site Council serves as the school community representative body for determining the focus of the school's academic instructional program and all related categorical resources. The Legislative intent for the formation of School Site Councils is that individuals who are most affected by the operation of the school should have a major role in the decisions regarding how a school functions. Education should be a joint effort of parents, teachers, administrators and other school staff - those whose common goal is the success of all students.

Purpose of School Site Council (SSC)

- Annually develop and approve the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)
- Develop site level parent involvement policy
- Review the school parent compact (Title I Schools)
- Advise the district in the development of the LCAP

School Site Councils provide the following:

- An opportunity to develop shared leadership
- An opportunity to improve communication between the staff and parents
- A place to discuss issues, programs and to make decisions
- A way to educate members regarding school programs and categorical programs


